Melbourne-based experimental theatre and film company Unicorn Productions is coming to Sydney for the first time bringing a brand new work ***Night's Wraith***.

Unicorn Productions has previously performed and exhibited in Melbourne, Adelaide, Wellington and Christchurch.

The new work is a film installation inspired by 50s avant-garde filmmaker Maya Deren. Displayed as part of a group digital art exhibition ***Electric Encounters*** at Plump Galleries in Newtown which is free to attend, this beautifully shot film work plays on a loop and explores themes of paranoia and the alter ego.

Unicorn Productions' last work ***Instructions to a Double*** was a piece of experiential intimate theatre revolving around a table at which the audience were seated which doubled as a screen showing projected films. The company toured this in Australia and their native New Zealand in 2009.
